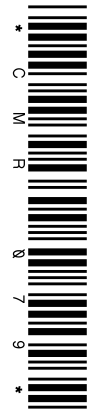

If an adult does not have decision-making capacity and there is no instructional advance care directive, then the health practitioner must obtain consent for medical treatment from the patient's Medical Treatment Decision Maker (MTDM), unless the medical treatment is an emergency

(refer to [Alfred Health Consent: Emergencies Guideline](#))

Who is the Medical Treatment Decision Maker?

'Medical Treatment Decision Maker' or 'MTDM' means, in relation to an adult patient, the first person in the list below who is reasonably available and willing and able to make the medical treatment decision (NB: there can only be one MTDM at a time):

- a person appointed by the patient under the *Medical Treatment Planning and Decisions Act 2016*
- a guardian appointed by VCAT who has the power to make medical treatment decisions
- the first of the following who has a close and continuing relationship with the patient:
 - the spouse or domestic partner of the patient
 - the primary carer of the patient
 - the oldest adult child of the patient **
 - the oldest parent of the patient **
 - the oldest adult sibling of the patient. **

** where the oldest adult child, parent or sibling is not available, willing or able to act, then refer to the next oldest person in that category before moving on to a lower category in the hierarchy.
